There's been a fair amount of knitting going on, not a lot of finishing. Five UFOs that I'm finding. This one isn't done:

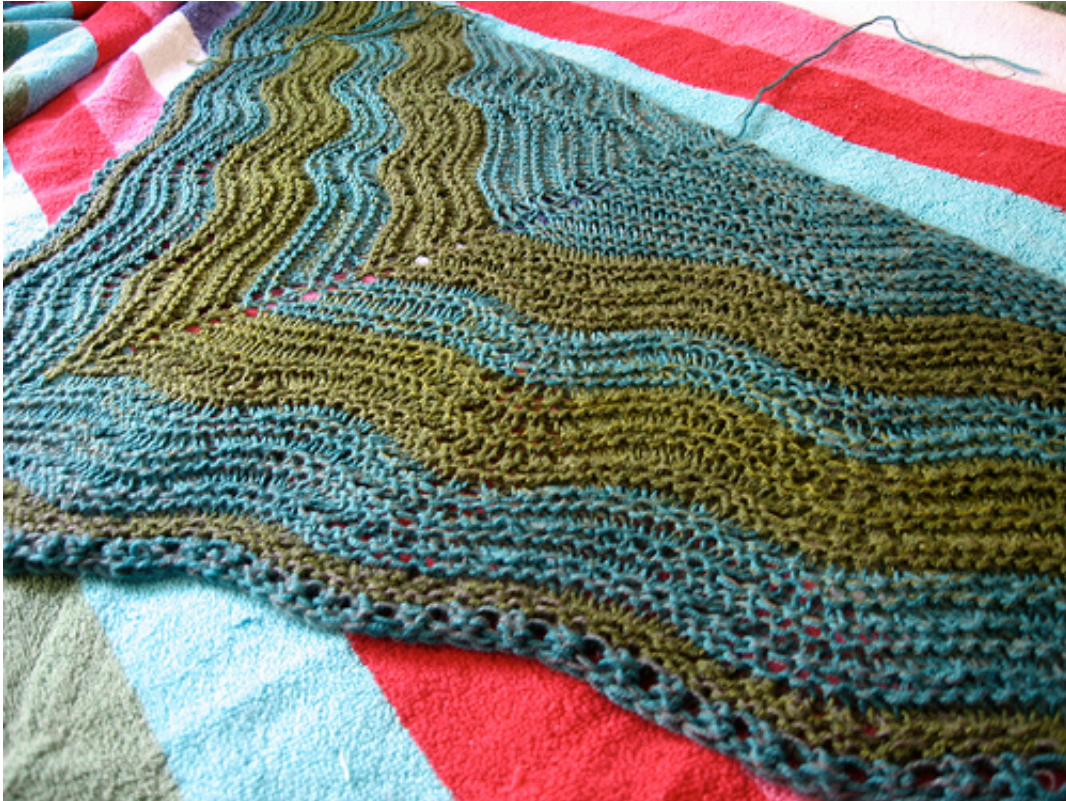


The Lily sweater in linen. I'm trying to do a few rows every few days to get it done in time to wear this summer. It will be a while. In contrast, this quick prayer shawl is almost done - only the ends need to be woven in:

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The Feather and Fan Comfort Shawl, done in some Alchemy fingering yarn and a leftover skein of Knitpicks Risata, carrying a cobweb yarn along for some depth. For about 400 yards of yarn, I've got a lovely prayer shawl to send to an online colleague who's going through some surgery.
